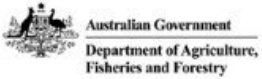

### Grazing Business Resilience Workshops

Last month, our Sustainable Ag Team had the pleasure of hosting the Grazing Business Resilience Workshop in both Toogoolawah and Boonah in collaboration with the Beef Extension team from the Queensland Government's Department of Primary Industries (DPI) and Rural Solutions Queensland.

The presenters discussed current programs and assistance available to farmers with the help of the Queensland Rural and Industry Development Authority (QRIDA) and Rural Financial Counselling Service to help improve drought preparedness and grazing business management while working through steps to develop an effective Farm Business Resilience Plan. Over 30 producers were guided through several activities working to identify key risks to their natural resources, production, business and people and developing goals and plans to improve their business sustainability and resilience.

## Somerset Beef Producers Group meeting

The Somerset Beef Producers Group met on 6 May at the Toogoolawah Golf club for an evening of updates on Healthy Land & Water's Climate Smart Agriculture project with special guests from QUT and Regen Farmers mutual.

QUT doctoral student Ella Dewilde and researcher Dr David Tucker want to know if acoustic measurements and motion activated cameras - tools referred to together as remote biodiversity assessment - are a practical tool for landholders to use themselves. By working with landholders through Healthy Land & Water's Climate Smart Agriculture Project, Ella and David hope to learn if remote biodiversity assessments are a practical and cost-effective tool for landholders to use and learn about the biodiversity on their farms.

Andrew Ward from Regen Farmers Mutual gave an inspiring presentation to the producers helping them identify, discover and develop opportunities to invest in their natural capital assets from various sources including government programs, environmental markets, philanthropy, local economic networks, and supply chains.

## How to Plan a Burn – landholder workshop



Our fire team (Queensland Fire & Biodiversity Consortium) hosted a highly praised 'How to Plan a Burn' workshop on 17 May in Crossdale, an interactive outdoor event guiding participants through the essentials of using fire as a land management tool. We covered topics such as burn area selection, regulatory compliance, site preparation, fuel hazard assessment, ignition techniques, and safety protocols.

Participants gained knowledge in the ecological benefits of burning in both pasture and environmental landscapes, learning how well-planned burns can improve biodiversity and enhance land productivity. Attendees appreciated engaging directly with the landscape outdoors to deepen their understanding of fire's role in sustainable land management.

Supported by the Queensland Government's Natural Resources Recovery Program and Somerset Regional Council, this free event empowered local landholders to care for their properties with confidence and ecological awareness. Thank you to our generous landholders who hosted us.

## Ask us about soil sampling: a foundation for sustainable agriculture



Our sustainable agriculture team was back in the paddock, visiting and working alongside landholders to conduct soil sampling to help understand and manage the health of our soils.

We extracted soil cores from across various paddocks to send for detailed lab analysis, assessing the nutrient availability and potential limitations for crop and pasture growth.

In the field, landholders received real-time insights on the physical traits of their soils and will be sent a comprehensive written report in the coming weeks. This report will include the laboratory results and tailored recommendations to support informed decision-making for sustainable land management.

These soil assessments are part of our ongoing commitment to supporting resilient, productive, and environmentally sound agricultural practices across South East Queensland. ## LCAT: The official tool used to track land condition improvements



The Land Condition Assessment Tool (LCAT) was developed to assess the condition of grazing land and provide useful information for graziers and land managers about the health and productivity of their pastures. LCAT is the official tool used to track land condition improvements across our Natural Resources Recovery Program (NRRP) on-farm project sites.

We received hands-on training from Rob Hassett (Queensland Government Department of Primary Industries), on how to use LCAT to assess land condition, how to guide landholders through understanding the results and how to apply this knowledge to improve the condition of their grazing land.

## Latest climate outlook from Bureau of Meteorology and Northern Australia Climate Program

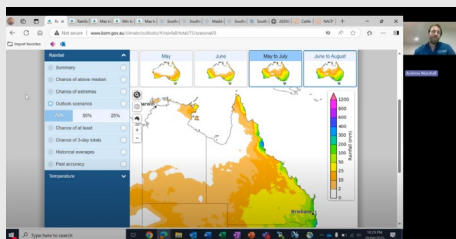

Held from May 19–22 in Gladstone, the symposium (themed *Strategies for Pest Success*) showcased the latest research, tools, and collaborative strategies for managing pest animals and weeds.

## Fire Ants spreading in 5 new LGAs: Residents and businesses take note

The widespread flooding associated with Ex-TC Alfred has unfortunately caused further spread of fire ants. Below is the latest update from the National Fire Ant Eradication Program.



Recent detections have led to the inclusion of several new suburbs in fire ant biosecurity zones.

Affected communities include those in **Brisbane City, Lockyer Valley, Moreton Bay, Scenic Rim, Somerset, Ipswich** and **Logan** LGAs. Palmview and the surrounding Sunshine Coast area are among the largest regions affected.

Anyone handling or transporting materials that can carry fire ants within the zones, such as soil, hay, straw, mulch, manure, quarry materials, turf, and potted plants, must comply with the biosecurity requirements.

### What you must do:

- Businesses – check your biosecurity zone, follow [movement controls](https://www.fireants.org.au/stop/movement-controls/movement-controls-guide), and use [fire ant-safe practices](https://www.fireants.org.au/stop/movement-controls/movement-controls-guide) (<https://www.fireants.org.au/stop/movement-controls/movement-controls-guide>).
- Residents – ensure materials purchased from these zones are handled safely (<https://www.fireants.org.au/stop/movement-advice-tool>).

Eradicating fire ants remains a national priority to protect Australia from their devastating impacts.

### **Exceptional Disaster Assistance Recovery Grants for Ex-TC Alfred – closing 2 April 2026**

Grants of up to \$25,000 are available for eligible affected producers and small businesses following Tropical Cyclone Alfred and Associated Severe Weather, 1 - 16 March 2025, to hire or purchase equipment and materials, clean up, remove debris, replace fencing and other costs associated with the recovery process. Eligible primary producer within the declared disaster area should take photographs of the direct damage to accompany their application/s.
